School leadership and governance


I hope you are finding the regular updates from governors useful. We want to share more with parents and families the role of governors within the school's organisational structure. So what then, do the governors of Lowther actually do?

- Together with the headship team they are responsible for making sure Lowther provides a good quality education.
- They provide challenge and support to the headship team drawing on their own knowledge and experience.
- They help make decisions together on matters such as performance, targets, school policies and school development plans.
- Governors monitor the impact of policies and oversee school budgets and staffing.
- They report on school achievements and respond to inspection recommendations.
- They hear appeals from pupils and staff and consider complaints.
- They ask questions and respect the position of headship team as the professional leaders of Lowther Primary School.

Illustrated below are how pupils at Lowther did with regard progress compared to other schools nationally. As you can see pupils make excellent progress at Lowther. Lowther's Got Talent 2015

Our fourth Lowther's Got Talent will have new judges who will be expecting the acts to pull out all the stops to make it to the final. There are 4 different categories that children can enter

The grand final which of course we'd love you to come and watch is on **Friday 30th January 2015** between 2pm and 3pm. It should be huge amounts of fun!
