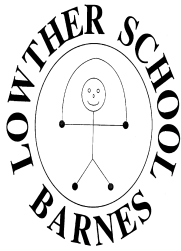


# LOWTHER SCHOOL FAMILY NEWSLETTER



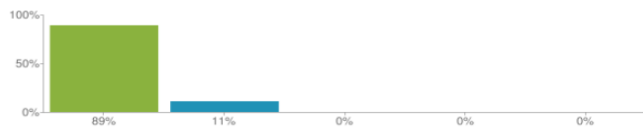

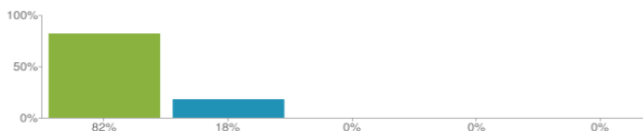
### 1. My child is happy at this school

Figures based on 76 responses up to 07-11-2016

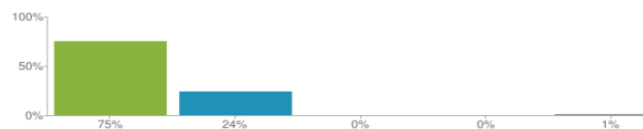
### 2. My child feels safe at this school



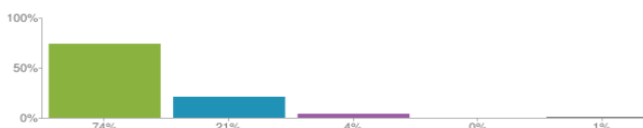
### 3. My child makes good progress at this school

## Takeover Day 2016

Takeover Day is next Friday (18/11) and we've already received over 50 letters of application. The deadline for applications is Monday so if your child is interested they'll need to get their letter in by then. All the other details about the day, that has become a bit of a Lowther institution, are indicated here. Applicants need to write a formal letter saying why they'd like the job and why they'd be good at it. Children can apply to be any teacher but their application should be to do something class based. If they'd like to do a role outside of the classroom they need to add that to their main letter. There are a limited number of jobs outside of the classroom. All children who gain a position have to complete these 3 requirements

1) They should have checked with the class teacher or the person they're taking over from as to times, job details etc.

2) They should be well planned and organised and know what they're doing

3) They should be dressed appropriately
