Whole School Homework Challenge 6

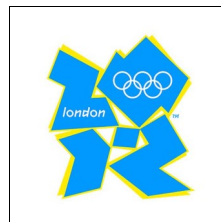
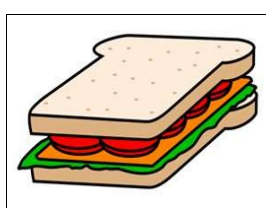
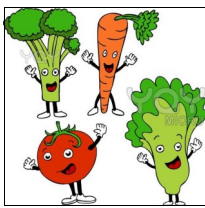
The next challenge is upon us. This homework challenge is set in conjunction with Chefs Sarah and Clare.
