This week

Following on from our very successful trip to Gunnersbury Toy museum last Thursday, we will be continuing the Toys topic. This will include numeracy, literacy and history.

In maths we will be starting to look at money. If you could count out money with your child, either at home (whatever is in your pocket), or in the shops (if there isn't a queue!) it will make the subject that much more immediate to them. We are not asking children to be able to count out money for themselves yet.

We are also continuing our rehearsals for the Nativity Play.

This week's homework:

English

- This week's words

- High Frequency words - please practice these with your child as often as possible.

If they wish, they can write in the shape of a leaf, and colour it in. A couple of leaf shapes are provided, but please feel free to be creative with this, the focus is on imaginative use of words and writing.
