Welcome to the May edition of the Lowther newsletter. This is our second newsletter since school closed back in March 2020. I know just how hard all of you have been working at home to support the children with their learning — thank you for your fabulous support.

I wanted to make a special mention here about all of the fantastic teachers and support staff we have in our awesome team here at Lowther. Recently they compiled a summary of the provision they have set up for your children for our governors. I also shared this work with our school improvement partner — they were so impressed they requested that our teachers excellent practice be shared with the Director of Children's Services for Richmond and Kingston. I am always very proud of our whole community but none more so than at this challenging time.

Of course, we are now into the last 7 weeks of the school year and we are all fully committed to making it as positive and engaging for all of your children as we can.

**Term dates**: PLEASE note that the holiday day planned for Monday 1st June was changed due to practical reasons. This means that the school year will now end on MONDAY 20th July 2020 and not Tuesday 21st July as had previously been the case, Thank you for understanding in why we felt this change was necessary.

The final half term is 7 weeks and 1 day. We will then have a six week holiday and school (virtual or actual) starts again for children on Thursday 3rd September 2020. Of course, at this stage we don't know what this will look like or whether indeed all pupils will be back at school then. Regardless, learning will commence, either at home or at school on this date. More details to follow as we have them.

**Inset days**: Friday 12th June will remain as an INSET day and so will Monday 15th June. School will be closed on both of those days.



## End of year routines:

**New mixed class lists:** Each year, around this time, teachers and leaders spend considerable time putting the classes for the next academic year together. We have started that work ready for September 2020. We consider lots of factors when deciding who is in each class. We believe this part of Lowther life has been really positive for our school and created so many additional friendships as well as study partners. Please do talk to Mr Bracken or myself if you'd like to know more about our rationale for mixing the classes each year. We expect to release the new lists later in June 2020.

Teaching team for next year: Around this time of year parents (and children) sometimes begin to wonder about who their teacher will be for next year. We work through this very carefully over the course of this term and will announce the teaching structure along with the new mixed classes in June. We have a highly dedicated, enthusiastic and skilled staff team and we'll all be working extremely hard to provide the very best education and school experience for your child. We will also share with you during w/c 15th June 2020 the different areas of school life that our teachers lead the school on.

Mr Bracken and I are looking forward to working together again next year to continue to support our drive to make Lowther the very best school.

We are lucky to have such fantastic facilities and we are committed to doing all we can to maintain our impressive site.


- We've cut back some of the trees at the front to give Nursery lots more light and to open up the front of the school to make it even more welcoming.

We love the changes, we hope you do too!












