Home learning from this week's topics

English: We have seen some super work coming in toward this terms 'Technology' grid - with some super research on different themes from radar to gaming! We have also had examples of very fine computing timelines.

Maths:

This week, we have continued looking at fractions, focusing on simplifying, adding and subtracting. Throughout this topic so far we have been finding the lowest common multiple (LCM), formally known as the lowest common denominator! This allows us to compare, order and add the fractions more easily.

We would like the children to please complete either A, B or C from the sheet in their books. Remember to challenge yourselves, and apply the methods you have learnt in class!

Please ensure this is completed - with full workings - neatly in <u>pencil</u>, <u>one digit per box</u>. We feel we have been very clear on these expectations [©]

Steps:

-find the lowest Common Multiple (both fractions need to have the same denominator)

-Find the equivalent fraction by multiplying the numerator by the same denominator (treat the little brother the same as the big brother)

-Add or subtract numerators to find the answer

$\frac{1}{3} + \frac{1}{5}$

$$\frac{5}{15} + \frac{3}{15} = \frac{8}{15}$$

The Teams:

Your role and support:
