<p>Expenditure: PE coach for 1.0 day per week</p> <p>Rationale: Sports intervention, specialist squad training as well as attending/organising sporting fixtures</p> <p>Impact: Improved performance in borough competitions over a sustained three year period e.g. Borough netball, football swimming and basketball finals in 2019. Football and basketball in 2018.</p>	£5,208
<p>Expenditure: 0.3 Sports Lead and additional administration</p> <p>Rationale: Oversee curriculum including coverage and progression, evaluation of different PE schemes. Audit equipment, organise fixtures, provide a range of sporting opportunities and co-ordinate health and activity week</p> <p>Impact: Curriculum that shows clear progression. Clearer co-ordination of sports fixtures and resources. Improved liaison with PE coach. Sustained sporting success and engagement</p>	£500/£160
<p>Expenditure: Richmond Sports & Fitness Partnership SLA</p> <p>Rationale: To be part of the borough network and to ensure children have regularly high quality opportunities to compete at a good level.</p> <p>Impact: Children can test their skills through opportunities to compete regularly at Borough Competitions. Improved performance at individual sports e.g. swimming as well as team sports e.g. football. Staff training provided. Networking with sporting leaders.</p>	£1,500
<p>Expenditure: PE Equipment re-stock</p> <p>Rational: Purchase new PE equipment to ensure PE lessons are easily and quickly resourced</p> <p>Impact: Lessons are better resourced and more easily set up – ensuring all children have access to equipment to ensure full participation in lessons. E.g. 30 new hockey balls mean all children are using a ball in each lesson.</p>	£400



<p>Expenditure: Squad caching</p> <p>Rational: Range of adults/coaches providing free (for the children) additional training opportunities as part of squads in different sports.</p> <p>Impact: Improved performance in borough competitions over a sustained three year period- roll call for 2018/19 - Champions of London – Basketball, Borough Champions– Basketball, Borough Champions – Girls basketball, Borough Runners up – Football, Borough Runners up – Netball, Borough Runners up – Boys swimming, Locality Champions – Y2 athletics. In addition strong performances at other events e.g. St Pauls football tournaments, borough sports, cross country etc.</p>	£500
<p>Expenditure: Borough Sports Competition</p> <p>Rationale: Provide children with an opportunity to compete in a high quality sports competition</p> <p>Impact: Strong team performances, narrowly missing a podium finish (also including multiple top three individual finishes) Increased confidence and esteem of pupils.</p>	£200
<p>Expenditure: Swimming Coach (and lifeguarding)</p> <p>Rationale: Ensure children's confidence in the water and to take full advantage for all children of free swimming offer at local secondary school. Also extra opportunities to train for the Borough swimming gala.</p> <p>Impact: Last 3 years have seen our best results at the highly competitive gala, with many individual as well as relay successes. Greater number of children in KS2 can swim. Boys came 2nd in borough swimming gala (first podium finish)</p>	£1800
<p>Expenditure: Lunchtime 'fit for sport' provision 2 people</p> <p>Rationale: Promoting playing of sport at lunchtime, teaching rules, ensuring fair play, engaging 'inactive pupils'</p> <p>Impact: Vulnerable children have been able to join in games and activities, greater levels of fair play in games such as football, creating happier and safer play times for all.</p>	£8,024
<p>Expenditure: 100+ Medals for Sports Day</p> <p>Rationale: Creating a competitive but inclusive system for sports</p> <p>Impact: Qualifying for a range of different events made sure a wide variety of children were able to compete for, and win, a medal, boosting self-esteem and interest and enjoyment of sport. It also supported a healthy competitive element.</p>	£200
<p>Expenditure: Cover for teachers/sports coach/teaching assistants to coach at local tournaments and sports competitions</p> <p>Rationale: Ensure children are coached and supported by members of the staff team with the right knowledge and expertise</p> <p>Impact: Sustained good performance at borough sports events. Multiple opportunities to represent the school at sport e.g. netball and football</p>	£1000
<p>Expenditure: Rakat membership for mini bus transport</p> <p>Rationale: Ensure efficient, safe and cost effective transportation to sports fixtures</p> <p>Impact: All pupils have safe and free access (cost is absorbed by the school)</p>	£50
<p>Expenditure: Track fees</p> <p>Rationale: Providing children an opportunity to train and practice on a professional running track</p> <p>Impact: Increased confidence and performance levels at Borough competition, including individual and relay top three finishes.</p>	£100
